

## Need to make a payment?

The IRS offers several options:

- **Electronic Funds Withdrawal.** Pay using your bank account when you e-file your return.
- **Direct Pay.** This electronic option (accessible via [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov)) allows you to schedule payments online from your checking or savings account with no additional fee and with immediate payment confirmation. This option is available only to those with a valid Social Security Number.
- **Credit or debit cards.** Pay your taxes by debit or credit card online (at [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov)), by phone (at 800-829-1040), or with a mobile device. The IRS does charge a fee for using a credit or debit card.
- **Mail in a payment.** See the other side of this sheet for instructions.
- **In person by appointment.** You may personally deliver your payment to the IRS walk-in office located at 825 East Rundberg, which is open 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. You **must have an appointment** in order to make a payment. Schedule an appointment by calling 1-844-545-5640. The walk-in office accepts checks, money orders, and cash payments (exact change required).
- **Pay with cash.** You can make a cash payment at a participating retail partner. See separate handout that outlines the steps to take to make a cash payment.
- **Installment agreement.** You may be able to make monthly payments, but you must file all required tax returns first. However, most include a fee to set up the plan. You can apply online, by mail (using Form 9465), or by phone (at 800-829-1040). There are three options for installment agreements:
  - a. Full payment now, meaning within 10 days -- no user fee
  - b. Short-term extension to pay: full payment within four months -- no user fee
  - c. Monthly payments: the most costly option considering penalties and interest plus a user fee of
    - \$149-\$225 for a standard payment agreement (or \$43 if you meet low-income guidelines)
    - \$31-\$107 for a direct debit payment agreement (or \$0 if you meet low-income guidelines)

## What Is Form 1040-V

It's a statement you send with your check or money order for any balance due on the "Amount you owe" line of your 2020 Form 1040, 1040-SR, or 1040-NR.

## Consider Making Your Tax Payment Electronically—It's Easy

You can make electronic payments online, by phone, or from a mobile device. Paying electronically is safe and secure. When you schedule your payment, you will receive immediate confirmation from the IRS. Go to [www.irs.gov/Payments](http://www.irs.gov/Payments) to see all your electronic payment options.

## How To Fill In Form 1040-V

**Line 1.** Enter your social security number (SSN).

If you are filing a joint return, enter the SSN shown first on your return.

**Line 2.** If you are filing a joint return, enter the SSN shown second on your return.

**Line 3.** Enter the amount you are paying by check or money order. If paying at IRS.gov, don't complete this form.

**Line 4.** Enter your name(s) and address exactly as shown on your return. Please print clearly.

## How To Prepare Your Payment

- Make your check or money order payable to "**United States Treasury.**" Don't send cash. If you want to pay in cash, in person, see *Pay by cash.*
- Make sure your name and address appear on your check or money order.
- Enter your daytime phone number and your SSN on your check or money order. If you have an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN), enter it wherever your SSN is requested. If you are filing a joint return, enter the SSN shown first on your return. Also, enter "2020 Form 1040," "2020 Form 1040-SR," or "2020 Form 1040-NR," whichever is appropriate.
- To help us process your payment, enter the amount on the right side of your check like this: \$ XXX.XX. Don't use dashes or lines (for example, don't enter "\$ XXX—" or "\$ XXX <sup>xx</sup>/<sub>100</sub>").

**Pay by cash.** This is an in-person payment option for individuals provided through retail partners with a maximum of \$1,000 per day per transaction. To make a cash payment, you must first be registered online at [www.officialpayments.com/fed](http://www.officialpayments.com/fed), our Official Payment provider.

## How To Send In Your 2020 Tax Return, Payment, and Form 1040-V

- Don't staple or otherwise attach your payment or Form 1040-V to your return. Instead, just put them loose in the envelope.
- Mail your 2020 tax return, payment, and Form 1040-V to the address shown on the back that applies to you.

## How To Pay Electronically

### Pay Online

Paying online is convenient, secure, and helps make sure we get your payments on time. You can pay using either of the following electronic payment methods. To pay your taxes online or for more information, go to [www.irs.gov/Payments](http://www.irs.gov/Payments).

### IRS Direct Pay

Pay your taxes directly from your checking or savings account at no cost to you. You receive instant confirmation that your payment has been made, and you can schedule your payment up to 30 days in advance.

### Debit or Credit Card

The IRS doesn't charge a fee for this service; the card processors do. The authorized card processors and their phone numbers are all on [www.irs.gov/Payments](http://www.irs.gov/Payments).
